#### **KEEPING YOUR CHILDREN SAFE & ASDA 'CASH POT FOR SCHOOLS'**

Please of course speak to us if you have accessibility requirements. If this is not the case, we would ask that the car park and the driveway is not used at these times as we seek to minimise the traffic using these areas. Thank-you again for helping us to keep everyone safe.
