Talking Together

We love to talk together while we play and in small groups, learning new vocabulary, listening, looking at each other while talking in soft tones and taking turns in a conversation. These early oracy skills are so important and will impact on your child's learning.

Why not look at objects together at home or a picture in a book asking your child “what do you see?” We are amazed at the fine details that the children notice!

Creating our own story scenarios have continued to be important and using the big black trays and the small sand tray has enabled the children to be imaginative or to enjoy exploring mathematical and scientific concepts when filling and emptying containers.

We continue to develop core strength in lots of ways: sitting with a straight back, in PE and hall times and when exploring big movements in our dance write sessions.

We love to help and when our new sand arrived we took on the 'delivery role' transporting wheelbarrow loads of sand with a Yr5 team. We have also started to explore 'balance' and how to balance blocks at a greater height and to build more elaborate block constructions.
