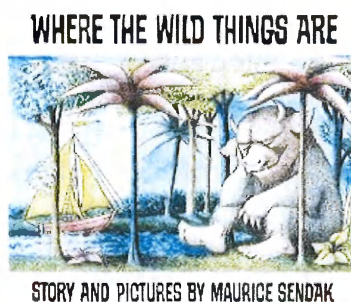
The love of stories and reading is regularly seen across the setting as the children share and act out stories during their own self chosen play.

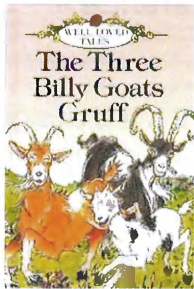


West End in School taught us how to dance and act out the story 'Where the wild things are

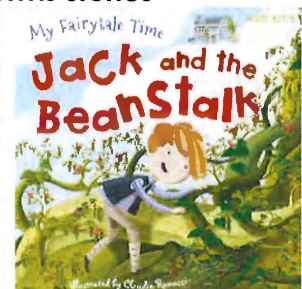
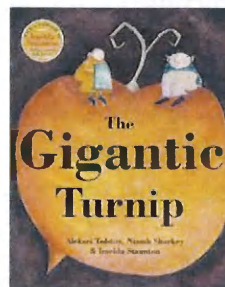
