(Simple and Compound Sentences)

Simple sentences

Simple sentences have only one clause. This means that they have one **subject** and a **verb**.

Example: The lion **growled**.

Compound Sentences

Compound sentences are two or more simple sentences joined with a **conjunction**.

Example: The lion growled **but** the mouse wasn't scared.
