Dear Parent/Carer,

Curriculum Visit – St Luke's Church – Harvest 2024

On Monday 21<sup>st</sup> October children from Years 1 – 6 will be visiting St. Lukes Church to experience and share in a celebration relating to the Christian festival of Harvest. The visit, which sits within the school's curriculum, will provide an experience supporting the children's awareness of the background relating to this festival and see them sharing in related songs, stories and poetry.

We are currently finalising details of who will be leading the celebration as unfortunately Fr Mathew Cashmore is not able to join us on this occasion.

It is a legal curriculum requirement that the school provide opportunities for children to be engaged with acts of worship of a broadly Christian nature reflecting the traditions of Christian belief. The aims of the visit to St Lukes are to:

- provide our children with an opportunity for stillness and reflection;
- promote children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development;
- celebrate the values and worth of the school community and all who belong in it;
- help children develop an understanding both of the nature and language of worship;
- help children develop respect and sensitivity to the beliefs and values of others.

*In the past we have invited donations of tins/larder supplies that will be passed on to THAT Foodbank on Queensway where they will be shared with people within the community and we are keen to do so again. **Given the difficult times being faced by many at the moment it is important that no one feels that they must donate items.** If you would like, and are able to provide something, we would be grateful if items could be brought to school by **Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October** where they will be displayed and recognised in our morning celebration assembly. The, very busy, foodbank tell us that they would welcome any non-perishables eg. tins, dried foods, cartons, packets.*

We will be walking to the church at 1pm and parents are welcome to join their child's class for the journey if they wish. Alternatively parents can make their own way to the church to enjoy the celebration taking place from around 1.30pm.

To enable us to travel to the church with your child it would be appreciated if you could sign and return the permission slip that your child will bring home with you today.
