## Invitation to Sports Day – Wednesday 12th July at 9:45am

I am writing to invite you to our Key Stage One and Reception Sports Day on the morning of Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> July, (weather permitting!). It will begin at 9:45am on our school field. Access on the day will be through the school's main entrance and Hub, with doors opening at 9.30am.

Teams will be made up from children across the school with family members in the same colour team. This means that all your children will be competing for the same team so you can cheer on one colour! Because the teams are across the school, the KS 1/FS2 scores will go forward into the afternoon and contribute to the overall winning team! Unfortunately only FS2 children will be able to take part this year.

Your child or children will need full PE kit on Wednesday 12th<sup>h</sup> July. This is a T-shirt, shorts or tracksuit bottoms and trainers or plimsolls. Children will be in a colour team of either red, blue, green or yellow and this colour is the same one they were in last year. As part of the 2012 Olympic legacy, these are still related to countries; red is China, blue is Italy, yellow is Australia and green is Brazil. There is absolutely no expectation of dressing in team colours, but if you have a coloured t-shirt which matches the team your child is in, please feel free to use this instead of the white PE t-shirt for this day.

As the day may be hot, please provide a sun hat, sunscreen and a labelled water bottle. There will be a rest stop and refreshments available for the children as part of the programme and for the adults, our parent-led Coffee and Cake team are kindly providing a refreshment stand..

In the event of wet weather, we will keep in touch about any changes to arrangements. In the meantime, if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask someone and we will try to answer them for you.
