## Looking ahead to 2024-25

This will be the first time that you are hearing from us looking forward to the next school year and sharing with you plans and arrangements to secure your children's best transition into their new classes. Supporting children and parents with this step is an important element of our role as we seek to build upon relationships held and secure future successes in learning.

Over the coming weeks you can expect the following:-

- On the morning of **Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July**, following a brief whole school assembly, children will join their new teacher in their new classroom for their **first session together** ahead of September. This will run from approx.. 9.15-10.15am.
- During the **final weeks of term** you can expect to receive a **transition newsletter** highlighting the value of strong transition and providing you with information about your child's new class and adults working with them.
- In the background, **teachers will be meeting with each other** to share useful information about your child and their learning, supporting the building of new relationships between children and the new adults working with them.
- After school on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July parents and children will be invited to meet their new teacher during a drop-in session that will take place from 3.30 5.00pm. We would encourage everyone along to this while this is unlikely to be an opportunity to have a lengthy discussion with your child's new teacher, it will be an opportunity to become acquainted and set up further discussions should you wish.

As we seek to make the very best arrangements to support children throughout the school next year some teachers will be moving year groups/classes. While this is a little untypical for Haytor View, be assured that this is being done with a view to securing the best outcomes for children, and indeed is not so untypical in other school settings.

With this in mind, a broad overview of where staff will be providing support and leading teaching next year is detailed at the bottom of this letter. This information will be formally shared with children when they join their new teacher on 4<sup>th</sup> July, however if you would like to discuss it with them ahead of this time please feel free.

As you look at our new staffing arrangements you will notice the absence of Miss Poucher, who we wish well as she continues her career as a teacher following her successful appointment to a role in Exeter – she leaves us with our thanks and best wishes. We will also be saying bye for now and a big thank-you to Mrs Pavledis and Mrs Louise who have supported us with specific areas of need this year – we hope that our association will continue in the future as needs arise.
