What have we been up to already? Year 3



Newton Abbot Community Interest Company are leading a new project in Buckland. The project is called Tunnels of Love and is linking local schools with artists to transform the Penn Inn subway into spaces where people want to be and interact with games, stories & imagery about who



they are. Last term, Year 3 had an amazing time creating and painting their own clay artwork and are looking forward to seeing these on display!

Last term, the children travelled back in time to prehistoric Britain and learned about the Stone Age and the Iron Age. They enjoyed finding out more from the historians on their exciting trip to Torquay Museum and enjoyed examining artefacts, making clay pots and drawing their own cave art.





During this term, the children will be learning about states of matter. The children have already started exploring solids, liquids and gases around us and now they will be learning about this further and linking this into their geography learning of the water cycle. They will be creating their own water cycle models and learning about the changing states of water as it travels.

Year 4



Last term the children enjoyed exploring their local surroundings using maps and compasses. The class spent time navigating their way around the Buckland Estate using maps and learning about the history of Newton Abbot.

Year 4 joined the foundation department to celebrate national Nursery Rhyme week. The children performed The Grand Old Duke of York. The class had great fun practicing and performing the rhyme.





This term the children will be creating moving pictures in DT. There is great excitement for learning all about volcanoes and earthquakes. The children are going to be learning about sound and how it travels, this will see the children linking this knowledge into their computing lessons for creating music.
